"A PROCLAMATION.

"Whereas the twenty-first section of the act of Congress, approved on the third instant, entitled "An act to amend the several acts heretofore passed to provide for the enrolling and calling out the national forces, and for other purposes, requires, 'that in addition to the other lawful penalties of the crime of desertion from the military or naval service, all persons who have deserted the military or naval service, all persons who have deserted the military or naval service, all persons who have deserted the military or naval service, all persons who have deserted the military or naval service as a Provost-Marshal within sixty says after the proclamation hereinafter mentioned shall be deemed and taken to have voluntarily relinquished and forfeited their rights to etitizens, and such deserters shall be forever incapable of holding any office of trust or profit timely the first profit of the prof

"Now, therefore, be it known that I. Abraham Lincoln, President of the United States, do issue this my Proclamation, as required by said act, ordering and requiring all deserters to return to their proper posts; and I do hereby notify them that all deserters who shaft, within sixty days from the date of this Proclamation, viz: on or before the luth of May, 1855, return to service, or report themselves to a Provact-Marshal, shall be pardoned, on condition that they return to their regiments and companies, or to such other original terms of enlistment, and, in addition thereto, a period equal to the time loss by desertion.

"The records and returns of these deserters will be made up in the same manner as is provided for in other cases by existing regulations, except that it will be noted on the book of deserters arrested, opposite the name of deserter, the fact of his having voluntarilly surrendered himself in conformity with the President's Proclamation; and the number; thus surrendering themselves to be separately stated on the report to this office.

The Secretary of War directs that no reward be paid for the arrest of deserters who may be arrested subsequent to the receipt of this office by the District Provost-Marshals.
