Double and treble thread screws are cut to obtain quick pitches on small rods. A quick pitch of a single thread on a small rod would cut it oft if is wore made deep enough to hoid. By having double or quadruple the number, this trouible is obviat $d$, but the speed of a nut or worm-whee drisern be a four-threaded scrow is no quicker than a stugle thread ot the same pitch. Serews are sometimes cut with square and sometimes with $V$ thrreads, to conform to the nature of the work they have to do.
