Reissues.—A reissue is granted to the original patentee, his heirs, or the assignees of the entire interest, when by reason of an insufficient or detective specification the original patent is invalid, provided the error has arisen from inadvertence, accident, or mistake, without any fraudulent or deceptive intention.

A patentee may, at his option, have in his reissue a separate patent for each distinct part of the invention comprehended in his original application, by paying the required fee in each case, and complying with the other required fee in each case, and complying with the other required fee in each case, and complying with the other requirements of the law, as in original applications.

Nor does the fact that one of the parties has aiready obtained a patent prevent such an interference; for, although the Commissioner has no power to cancer a patent aiready issued, he may, if he finds that another person was the prior inventor, give him also a patent, and thus place them on an equal tooting before the courts and the public




